Information governance

Governance is required at all levels of an organization, for the following purposes:

- Defining the overall standards and requirements of information
- Interpreting the standards and requirements for localized language, laws and individualized requirements
- Applying the standards and requirements according to precise systems and processes

Governance is a shared responsibility, and organizations must have a set of basic foundational elements to initiate and support it. With Information Governance Catalog Trial Edition, you can explore existing foundational elements, or create your own. At the same time, the trial gives you the opportunity to evaluate the simplicity and ease of use of the tool.

Business glossary: Define information in a well-formed glossary aligned with the language of the business. Glossaries include relationships, dependencies, usages, structures, domains and owners, and provide deep semantic understanding of a given concept or term. Using glossaries, users can learn and interpret the language and concepts of the business.

Governance policies and rules: Document the requirements or specifications of information, as a set of policies and supporting rules. Policies capture the greater intent of a given requirement, whereas rules capture the tribal knowledge or restrictions when accessing or sharing such information, and are associated with the need to control data access or lifecycle. Policies and rules are often driven by compliance regulations such as the Basel banking regulations or the HIPPA insurance regulations.

Stewardship: Establish the ownership of information, responsibility and control. Stewardship requires naming the person responsible for describing and tagging information, to better facilitate discovery and usage by other users. Additionally, it helps ensure adherence to policies.

Classification: Identify the structure and markup of information, through advanced analysis and profiling data, driving auto-classification and auto-identification services and self-service governance.

Analysis reporting: Capture the usage or consumption of information, as information is formed and shaped across the information landscape. This includes looking at which expressions or processes altered the information, influencing confidence or trust in that information and the analytics it may support.




Figure 1: A glossary term with associated domain, steward and governance rule information




Figure 2: Information Governance Catalog launch page
