

Are you making the most out of every square inch, meter and bit of your space?

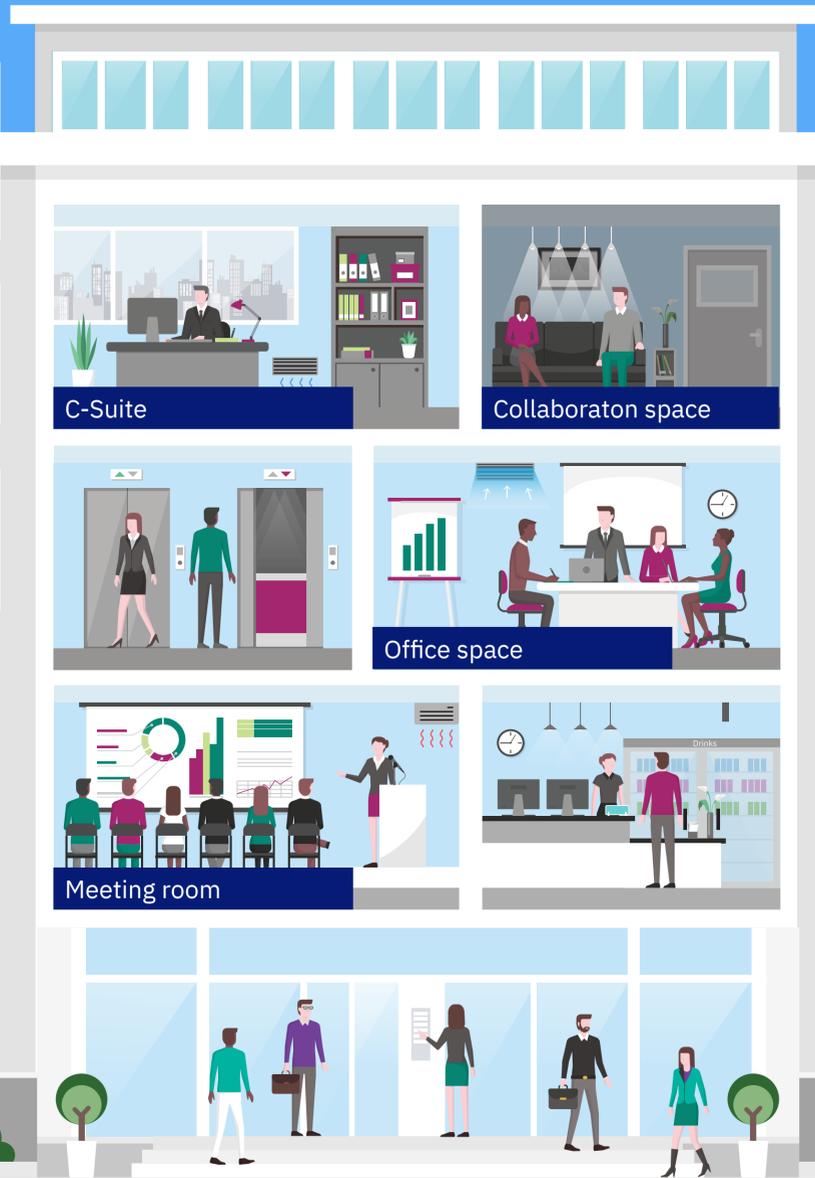
