



License Supplement for IBM Capacity Backup (CBU) for Power Enterprise Systems Offering

This License Supplement for the IBM Capacity Backup (CBU) for Power Enterprise System Offering (“License Supplement”) is in addition to the terms of client’s IBM International Program License Agreement (IPLA), International Agreement for Acquisition of Software Maintenance (IAASM), Client Relationship Agreement (CRA), and when using IBM i, the IBM i CBU Amendment (GC52-1234). Client accepts the terms of this License Supplement, on behalf of client’s Enterprise, by selecting “I’ve read and I agree with the terms and conditions”. Capitalized terms not defined in this License Supplement are defined in the Agreement.

The CBU for Power Enterprise Systems Offering is available for the Power E870, E870C, E880, and E880C systems.

The following requirements apply to CBU for Power Enterprise Systems:

- A client must own a Power Systems E870, E870C, E880, or E880C for production purposes (“Production System”, also called “Primary System” or “Primary Machine”).
- The CBU model must match the model of the Production System.
- The Production System and CBU must be owned in the same enterprise.
- The CBU must have exactly eight (8) static processor core activations.
- The CBU and Production System pairing must be registered at <http://www.ibm.com/systems/power/hardware/cbu/>.
- Only one (1) CBU system can be paired with a Production System.
- The client is allowed to purchase the number of CBU processor nodes up to the same number of processor nodes found in the client’s registered Production System.

For every active mobile core on the Production System, the client is entitled to receive, at no extra charge, 11,680 Elastic Capacity on Demand (“ECoD”) GB days of memory activations on the CBU. The client must request the ECoD GB memory days from their IBM representative or authorized IBM reseller. The client is required to activate the ECoD GB memory days as soon as the CBU is installed. The client is entitled to refresh the number of ECoD GB days annually for as long as they own their registered Production System and CBU, or until IBM withdraws the CBU for Power Enterprise Systems offering.

The following terms of the IBM i CBU Amendment do not apply when IBM i is used with CBU for Power Enterprise Systems: Section 3 “Additional Configurations”.

If there is a conflict between the terms of this License Supplement and the IBM i CBU Amendment, the terms of this License Supplement prevail.
